The week beginning the 14th November, in school, is Enterprise Week. During Enterprise Week, all the children will be using their Enterprise Skills to create products and services ready to sell on Friday 18thNovember to raise money for Children in Need

We would like to invite you to join your child, if you can, on Friday 18th from 1.30 p.m. The afternoon is split into two halves. One half is for children to visit other classrooms to purchase the goods or services on sale. The other half is a swap and those that have been buying then become the sellers and vice versa.

If you can join us, you are invited to help your child as 'sellers' to sell their particular goods and/or services and accompany them as 'buyers' to other classrooms. From 1.30 p.m. to 2.10 p.m. one half of the school will sell from their classroom and the other half will buy. At 2.15 p.m. the children will swap roles until 2.55 p.m. At 2.55 p.m. we will ask all parents to leave, so that we can tidy up and get ready to go home. Children can bring in money (in a named purse or envelope) to spend at the different stalls in different classrooms.
